Easter - Celebrating the New Covenant

I was recently talking with some friends when the topic of the New and Old Testament surfaced. "Why do we need the Old Testament?" is often the most pressing question asked regarding them.

The word used for "testament" carries the meaning of a covenant. A covenant is literally a contract. Biblically, the covenant is usually between God and people. So then, what's the need for both an Old Covenant and a New Covenant?



In the Old Testament/Covenant God made several "contracts" with various people. Do you remember them or can you guess what they were? The first covenant was with Adam and Eve to work and be the caretakers of the garden of Eden. They broke the covenant when they ate fruit from the one tree God told them not to eat from, and were kicked out of Eden. The second covenant was with Noah when God stated He would never again destroy the earth by flood, and you know the sign of the covenant... a rainbow. In the third covenant with Abraham, God created a great nation that would be God's people. They would be blessed by God and be a blessing of God to other people. God kept his covenant with Abraham and Israel was birthed.

The final Old Testament/Covenant was the Law of Moses. When Israel escaped Egypt and met with God at Mt Sinai, God made a covenant with the people using the 10 commandments (and other laws). If you follow my Laws, I will be your God and you will be my people. Because God knew people were imperfect, within the law he created a way for people to remain in fellowship with him even when they were disobedient. This was through a sacrificial system, i.e., when they sinned, an animal sacrifice was made to atone for the sin... innocent blood must be shed. This sacrificial system at the time lined up with many other cultures of the day, each which had some type of blood sacrifice to the gods, including the sacrifice of children.

In God's perfect timing, he sent Jesus to be the final sacrifice for all the sins (past, present, future) of the world. This is the newest and final covenant God has offered to people. This last contract is what we now know as the New Testament. This covenant, according to the new testament is the last one where we can be in relationship with God. This covenant which God extends to all people can only be accepted by our declaration of belief in Jesus as God's Son, who died on the cross for our sins and rose from the dead on the third day. This covenant supersedes the old covenant.

So, the need for an Old Testament is to point to a God who created us to be in a relationship with him. It points to a God who continually loves and chases after his people, especially when they break covenant with God. The New Testament is God's final act of establishing an eternal covenant with all people, sending His Son, Jesus, to be the final sacrifice.

This aster let us join together in celebrating The New Covenant with God the Father, Jesus the Son, and God the Holy Spirit, for all they have done and continue to do so that we might truly live.
