Pastor Paul asked if I would write a "look back on the year of our church" article for the first newsletter of 2019.

We continue to have between fifty-five and sixty-five people in worship each week. Yet, I am always amazed when I reflect on the life of our church everything our family can achieve.

We have devoted women who lovingly turn out beautiful quilts each week to give peace and comfort to the suffering. We have enough people willing to learn and grow that we can sustain a mid-week Bible study and an adult Sunday School class.

Our choir and praise band use their talent and share it so we can worship through music. We have put on plays written and performed by our members, to give us a different way to worship and think about ourselves as Christians.

We had a wonderful Summer service outside in the church yard, giving the village a chance to see and hear who we are. This congregation filled almost fifty shoe boxes to ensure children across the world could see God at work in their lives, and provide them with some Christmas joy.

We dug deep and gave back to God and this church in our "Catch-up" offering, helping to meet our financial obligations. I once heard a pastor ask a congregation, "If all of a sudden this church disappeared would the community notice it?" We are all aware that we are a small church. Oh, I'm sure the community would miss our hot dogs on Memorial Day, the annual turkey dinner, and our cookie walk but we are so much more. This year as I was weighing and selling cookies at the cookie walk, a woman buying cookies had been at the Saturday morning AA meeting; I thanked her and she said, "No, thank you, this place saved my life."

Every other Saturday families can come and be blessed by our personal needs pantry. Our gas card ministry helps people keep the ability to get to much needed appointments. Our pastor's helping hand fund gives aid to those we never see. The local Teen Center has been blessed by donations from our women's group and a tithe from our Christmas Eve service.

We have provided physical and spiritual sustenance to five grieving families through our funeral luncheons, one long time Hartland family only needed our fellowship hall. I like to think that every Sunday when the bell tolls it gives a sense of comfort to our little village. If they never choose to come and worship, I hope they would miss us if we disappeared. I hope every visitor continues to be greeted in welcoming love. As we anticipate the blessings of the coming year I leave you with this: A Disciple is someone who has moved from being the RECIPIENT of the church's mission to being RESPONSIBLE for the church's mission.

I wish each of you a blessed and healthy New Year, with love and prayer we can accomplish even more in 2019.

But you refused and made me wait."


