



> Pastor's Message <>



I received an email the other day from a 17 year old that started,

Hello, I am writing to try to find God.

I have to admit, this isn't an email I see every day, yet it reminded me of some really important lessons I needed to hear/see again. The young man went on in his email to say he had been experiencing a tough time both emotionally and spiritually. He stated he was a... "non-practicing Christian and his faith didn't seem like something to turn to."

As Christians, we need to remember this **first lesson**... everyone runs into difficult moments in life, and no one is exempt from tough days. It doesn't matter if you are a Christian or not! I have them, and I know you have them too. Everyone, the young and the old, people you see at the store, everyone of your neighbors or work associates experience difficult moments in life.

The immediate reason why this young man's faith did not seem helpful was found in his phrase, "non-practicing Christian." As I continued into his letter he wrote "*my parents believed in God but were not spiritually minded.*" This said to me that he wasn't receiving any spiritual guidance and therefore he did not know what faith in God really meant. Lesson two is this, simply believing in God does not mean you have an active faith. Faith must be practiced (prayer, worship, ministry, missions, witnessing, giving, Bible study) if it is going to become a powerful connector to the one who can help us in and through life.

Now right after he wrote about how his faith seemed inadequate, he wrote...

However, about a week ago, I suddenly felt as though Faith and God was something that I need to turn to in order to get through this difficult time that I have been going through. So I have made the decision to contact you with a few relatively simple questions to try to help me find out where I belong spiritually.

Lesson three...I was reminded again how the Holy Spirit is in the business of drawing all people to God, especially during difficult times. This young man was somehow touched by God so that he "suddenly felt as though Faith and God was something that I need to turn to in order to get through." We need to remember the Holy Spirit does the heavy lifting when it comes to drawing people to God.

Lesson four... there are always people who are looking for God, and God needs Christians who are further down the "spiritual road" to help guide them. And God wants us to help them into a relationship or grow deeper in their relationship with God. So, the question is... are you willing and/or able to help others to find God or grow deeper in their understanding of God? If the answer is "no", then what are you willing to do to change it?

To help, this summer we will begin by reconnecting with God through the 31 Day Prayer Challenge in June. Then, in July/August, we will look at some avenues to strengthen our ability to help others in their relationship with God. You never know when God might call you to help someone find God, or to help strengthen another's walk with God. Like the Girl and Boy Scouts motto says, "Always Be Prepared!"




Gas Card Ministry

When these cards are ordered, the church just pays a percentage of the face value. There are gas cards, discount store cards, restaurants, department stores and many, many more cards available. Several cards are offered at a table in the Fellowship Hall for immediate purchase.

Thank you for supporting our Scrip program. All money made through the Scrip program goes into the General Fund and helps support our church.

Hartland UMC has been associated with the Scrip program since 2006. Since that time, *over \$14,400 has gone into the General Fund*. So far, in **2014**, *over \$447 has gone into the General Fund*. This is with an average of just <u>under 6 families</u> participating each week! Thank you to all of you who shop our Scrip Table! Your support is appreciated!
