So we can safely say, the Coronavirus has had a major impact on our world, on our country, on our state, on our community, and on our church. I've stated before, this is a time most people will remember for the rest of their lives. In 10 years someone will say, "Remember Covid-19?", and people will nod their heads. We will not soon forget.

When we say it has had an impact on our church, it is broader than just each congregation not meeting together for worship, bible studies, meetings, and other gatherings (although we still worship virtually on Facebook and our website, as well as Bible Study and meetings on Zoom). About 3 weeks ago, the worldwide General Conference of the United Methodist Church postponed their 862 delegates from its every four year gathering, this year in Minnesota from May 5-10. Then about 10 days ago, the Michigan Annual Conference postponed its 1900 or so delegates from gathering in Traverse City at the end of May. Finally, this week all Jurisdictional conferences (they elect and assign Bishops to Annual Conferences) have been cancelled, stating that they will probably meet next in 2021.

Which means any decisions by the General Conference will have to wait until they do meet. The logistics alone to book a venue and get the 45% of the delegates from around the world (rest from the U.S.A.) to this conference (and depending on how each country is handling COVID-19) suggests they might not meet until 2021either.

So we will as a worldwide United Methodist Church remain united. The Protocol of Grace and Reconciliation Through Separation will wait until they do meet. Despite these times, Pastors who are retiring will retire. Pastors who have been re-appointed will move to new churches. We will continue on in ministry, serving God, our communities, each other, and reaching out to the un-churched with the love of God.

On Monday, March 23, Gov. Gretchen Whitmer issued an Executive Order to slow the spread of the COVID-19 coronavirus. Today, based on recommendations from state health officials, the Governor has extended that order to May 15, 2020. The Executive Order continues to advise all faith communities to refrain from in-person worship and keep church buildings closed. For this reason, Bishop David Bard is also recommending Michigan United Methodist Churches continue to follow these recommendations until at least May 15, 2020.

Executive Order No. 2020-59, requires all Michigan residents and most businesses to stay in their homes, except for essential life-sustaining purposes. The order took effect at 11:01 A.M. Friday, March 24 and remains in effect until at least May 15, 2020.

While the new order recommends that we not hold in-person worship, The United Methodist Church of Michigan continues to be the church every day of this crisis. This Bishop continues to encourage local churches to hold online or telephone-based worship each week, to set up systems to receive electronic offerings that support much needed mission and ministry, and to be in safe connection with those sheltered at home. Bishop Bard has announced he will address the Michigan Conference next week in a video message about this Executive Order and other measures being planned to safely re-open local churches.


Financial Page






?? Back to Normal??
