# → Pastor's Message <</p>



One of my sons and I recently attended a Red Wings game (National Hockey League) down at Joe Louis Center in Detroit. The first and last time I had been to a Red Wings game, was back in 1984, when they were referred to as the Dead Wings. It was because they were really not a very good team.

Now for a little Red Wings history. Prior to 1984, the Wings had a 33 year period where they were really good. From 1936 to 1966 the Wings appeared in more than half of the Stanley Cup Finals (18 times). Of those 18 appearances, they won the Cup seven times ('36, '37,'43, '50, '52, '54, '55). In a 19 year period span (1936-1955), they were winning more than one third of the Stanley Cups and appeared in 11 of the finals (almost 2/3rds). So these were some great years to be a Wings fan.

Unfortunately the next 15 years was another story. From 1967 to 1982, they became known as the Dead Wings, only making the playoffs two times in those years. Then two events took place to change their direction. In 1982, Mike Illitch became the owner of the Red Wings. Then in 1983 they signed a young man named Steve Yzerman to play for their team, and the label "Dead Wings" faded for good. They still wouldn't reach the Stanley Cup finals for another 12 years, but with hard work they began to make the playoffs again... a step in the right direction.

Finally in 1995 they made it to the Stanley Cup Finals again. Two years later they would win the Stanley Cup and would win four more over a 12 year period. To show you how dominate they became, they appeared in six of the 12 Stanley Cup finals between 1995-2007. It was good to be a Wings fan again.

One of the reasons I give you such a detailed account is when my son and I got to the game, I took a picture of their arena rafters. What a sight! All those banners hanging... showing the accomplishments of the Red Wings through the years. What a great history they have had.

The other day I spent some time with a couple of guys doing some work. As we were talking, the conversation turned our parents. We all loved our parents and spoke of some of our memories. Then one of the guys whose dad had died in his 40's said something like this. "As we get older, we tend to get to know our parents better, more as friends. I missed out on that with my dad as did you Pastor." It's sad to think that the history or friendships we could have had with our fathers was nearly non-existent. But then there are many whose parents have lived a long life yet their relationship with their parents has been pretty non-existent too.

Here is the point. All relationships take work! If we want to have good relationships with others, we have to invest time and effort in them. Talking, sharing not just information but sharing feelings too along with listening to others to understand them, not judge them is what makes relationships grow. Friendships are based on dialogue, often over subjects of similar interests that take place over time. If you are willing to risk developing relationships, know this... you will be blessed and hopefully be a blessing too.

In the same manner with God, what kind of relationship will you have with God if you interact for with God for two hours each week and ignore God for the remainder of the week? What do you expect from God, relationship wise, if the investment with God is only 1% of your week? What might happen if you spent 1% of each day (24 minutes) with God in conversation?

As I think about what kind of relationship I will have with my kids in the future, it will depend on the intentional time I spend with them now. Sometimes it is very casual conversations, sometimes it deeper... but what is happening is building for the future of the relationship. So build away, with your kids, your spouses, other family members, with your friends and with God. Note that the only things that make it to heaven from this earthly life are our relationships... as they last forever.

All men and friends of Hartland United Methodist Church are invited to join in this time of good fellowship and good food while serving their church.




### **United Methodist Women**

#### **Scrip News**


Thank you for supporting our Scrip program this year. All money made through the Scrip program goes into the General Fund and helps support our church.

Scrip is a program where gift cards from a variety of companies can be purchased. You pay the full face value of the card. When these cards are ordered, the church just pays a percentage of the face value. There are gas cards, discount store cards, restaurants, department stores and many, many more cards available. Several cards are offered at a table in the Fellowship Hall for immediate purchase.

Hartland UMC has been associated with the Scrip program since 2006. Since that time, over \$13,171 has gone into the General Fund; just in 2013, over \$314 has gone into the General Fund. And this is with an average of just over 6 families participating each week! Thank you to all of you who shop our Scrip Table! Your support is appreciated!
