> Musings from the Pastor &

Would you agree with me that God is good and God is perfect? Would you also agree with me that God created all things good? Would you finally agree that God gave us life so that we could really live life to the full? Well, if God is good & perfect and created us perfectly to live life, then why does it at times seem so difficult to live a good life?

What I've noticed in general about people is we all have a strand of ongoing thoughts which seem to cycle in our brains at a constant rate. For some people this strand of thoughts tend to be more negative... "I can't do it"... "I'll never amount to much"... "I am not good enough"... "I am not very pretty/handsome"... "I am not worth other people's time"... and the list goes on. Realize this one thing... all people entertain some negative thinking about themselves from time to time. For instance, some professional models (both male and female) believe they are really not handsome or pretty. In fact, many front covers of magazines or movie posters have been air brushed so that the person or people on it are made more "perfect". Friends, nobody is perfect...everyone has flaws. The world would have you believe there are perfect people and you are not one of them. Yet this is not the truth as no one is perfect in thoughts, in action or in beauty.

There is a saying that goes something like this... You become what you believe about yourself. Instead of allowing negative thoughts to rule your mind, why not plant in your mind this truth... "I am a child of God's and am perfectly loved by God." When you begin to understand your worth in light of God's love for you, the negative thoughts begin to go away. You begin to understand that you can do all things because God gives you the ability and strength to do them. When you begin to understand just how important you are to God, important enough for Jesus to have sacrificed his life for you, then you find your worth is not found based on outward beauty or the things you can do. In fact outward beauty or ability tends to cause people to become vain or prideful about themselves, which does not help people live godly lives.

As I have given, and continue to give my self-doubts to God... as I remember my worth in God... it leads me to live a life of gratitude. Instead of allowing negative thoughts to fill my mind, I join with the psalmists (*Psalm 106 & 136*) who wrote so many years ago...

Give thanks to the Lord, for he is good. His love endures forever.

As we approach the Thanksgiving and Christmas seasons, let us indeed live a life that is filled with gratitude for all God has done and all that God is continuing to do in our lives. Instead of waiting for someone to give you something, go out and serve others. Visit a friend or someone who doesn't get out often. Give your time to a worthy cause here at the church or in the community. God set us free to live life... so go out and live your life, giving the glory to God.




