Sermon Notes July 21, 2019 Faith on the Big Screen: Toy Story 4

We have all want to <u>live</u> a good <u>life</u>.

The Bible uses a word which associates living in a <u>correct</u> place with God, the word is <u>righteous</u>.

It seems there are two basic paths for living a righteous life before God:

- 1. Abraham's righteousness came through <u>belief</u> in the Lord God.
- 2. After the Mosaic <u>law</u> one must live in <u>obedience</u> to the <u>law</u> to be considered righteous.

Living unrighteous lives doesn't <u>separate</u> us from God in the after-life, it <u>separates</u> us from God <u>now</u>.

At one time Paul <u>believed</u>, because he followed the <u>law</u> faultlessly, he was a righteous person.

As Paul grows in Jesus, he learns righteousness comes <u>from</u> God on the basis of <u>faith</u> in Jesus.

The pursuit of righteousness is more than knowing about Jesus, it is knowing Jesus more.

Weekly Devotions

God speaks to us today by the Holy Spirit. Jesus said about the Holy Spirit,

"But the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will *teach* you all things and will *remind* you of everything I have said to you."

- 1. Ask God to first quiet your heart and mind so that you are available to God.
- 2. Ask God to speak to your heart as you read the scripture for the day.

 - b. In one or two sentences, write down the impression you received as your read this particular part of the scripture.
 - c. Finally write down what you feel God wants you to learn or do as a result of what impressed you.
