This story appeared in the RGB blog, and is so fitting for our Advent season. *A blind boy sat on the steps of a building with a hat by his feet. He held up a sign which read, "I am blind, please help." There were only a few coins in the hat – spare change from folks as they hurried past.*

A man was walking by. He took a few coins from his pocket and dropped them into the hat. He then took the sign, turned it around, and wrote some words. Then he put the sign back in the boy's hand so that everyone who walked by would see the new words. Soon the hat began to fill up. A lot more people were giving money to the blind boy. That afternoon, the man who had changed the sign returned to see how things were. The boy recognized his footsteps and asked, "Were you the one who changed my sign this morning? What did you write?" The man said, "I only wrote the truth. I said what you said but in a different way." I wrote, "Today is a beautiful day, but I cannot see it." Both signs spoke the truth. But the first sign simply said the boy was blind, while the second sign conveyed to everyone walking by how grateful they should be to see...



Finance News Update

For 2019 the Church has enjoyed healthy contributions to the Building Fund, Endowment Fund, Food Bank, Memorial Fund, Pastors Helping Hand...as well as several other needs. These donations have been used to make a difference in the lives of many. From January to September the Church had received contribution to the General Fund allowing us to stay current with all bills, maintain a small reserve and pay a small portion of the Ministry Shares Common Apportionments. Beginning in October, giving has declined and the small reserve has been used and some bills may not be paid. In addition we spent a large portion of the Emergency Fund to replace several items within the Rental House including a new Water Tank, Stove and Hot Water Heater. There are several other things that need to be fixed. The Trustees are working on preparing a quote of what is needed and the cost.

Today we need to focus on "**Catching Up**". The Finance Committee has approved starting the Catch Up program. We are asking each of you to prayerfully consider giving to the Catch Up program starting now. All giving will be designated to the General Fund for use as reviewed and approved by the Finance Committee and Administrative Council. We will use these donations to pay bills and increase the Emergency Fund, and hopefully keep a small reserve going into 2020.

The Finance Committee wishes to thank you in advance for your generosity and continued support of the mission we all accept as members of the Hartland United Methodist Church.

News from the Frontier

One day and expert in religious law stood up to test Jesus by asking him this question: "Teacher, what should I do to inherit eternal life?" Jesus replied, "What does the law of Moses say? How do you read it?" The man answered, "You must love the Lord your God with all you heart, all your soul, all your strength and all your mind.' And, 'Love your neighbor as yourself."" "Right!" Jesus told him. "Do this and you will live!" The man wanted to justify his actions, so he asked Jesus, "And who is my neighbor?" Jesus replied with a story ...

We are in Panama City, Florida working with the Bay Count Habitat trying to get their disaster repair program running. Hurricane Michael swept through the panhandle of Florida more than a year ago and there are still many roofs with blue tarps, siding is missing and trees are still leaning on houses.

Many structures will never be rebuilt but we are helping fix what we can. When we arrived, we were given the short list of 21 homes with critical repairs that were already qualified. The affiliate has contracted with a roofing company to re-shingle roofs but needed someone to fix soffit, fascia, siding, doors and windows and that is what we are doing. We spent the first two days visiting the properties and getting material lists. Then looked in the warehouse for materials that were on hand while other things got ordered. We have been here for three weeks now and have finished repairs on a few houses, done partial repairs on several while waiting for materials to complete them. We also did some assessments and turned them in for the affiliate to decide if the project is beyond the scope of what they can handle. Below is one of those:





This house has lost most of its siding, the windows are single pane glass and not fitted in the openings well, there is rot or termite damage in many areas that was not caused by the hurricane but was exposed by it. In our estimation it is a tear-down but the roof was so bad right after the hurricane that it was high on the list to get a new one. That was done before any other evaluation was completed. The second problem is the family that lives here has nowhere else to go and can't afford to move. The house is worth about \$9,000, so how do you decide whether to fix it or not.

Since writing the above, the affiliate has decided to fix this house. We are a few days into the repair and things are going well. We will be working on it for a few more days. Besides this house there is enough work here to keep us busy well into next year. We currently are staying in an RV resort for November and December. We have other arrangements in the area through January. Most campgrounds in the area are full in February so we have plans to go somewhere else for a while. We feel we will need a break from here by then anyway.

We ask everyone to continue praying for us while we are here. We hope that God will use us in a way that brings glory to Him in everything we do. And if anyone needs to get out of the cold and snow let us know, we love company and could use some extra help.


