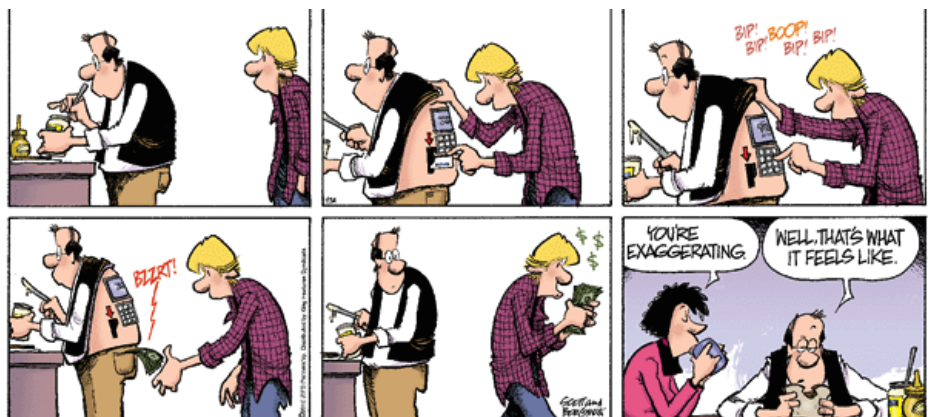

(Matthew 10:42).
