Finance News Update

For 2022 the Church has enjoyed giving to the Building Fund, Food Bank, Memorial Fund, Pastors Helping Hand...as well as several other needs. These donations have been used to make a difference in the lives of many. During the first quarter of the year, the church received enough contributions to the General Fund allowing us to remain current on bills and maintain a healthy reserve as well. Beginning in April giving has declined and the reserve has been completely used by September.

Today we need to focus on "Catching Up". The Finance Committee has received approval to start the annual Catch-Up program. We are asking each of you to prayerfully consider giving to the Catch-Up program starting now and ending Christmas day December25, 2022. All giving will be designated to the General Fund for use as reviewed and approved by the Finance Committee and Administrative Council. We will use these donations to pay bills and a portion of the Ministry Shares (apportionments) as well as create a small reserve.

MMDC is a warehouse for UM Committee on Relief re-

sources. MMDC's cleaning kit supply was depleted due to the number of U.S. disasters this year, including flooding in Kentucky and St. Louis, and then Hurricane Ian in Florida. Dan O'Malley, Michigan Disaster Response Coordinator, took the lead in managing the collection of kits. Michigan received a total of 357 empty buckets, 121 full buckets, and 153 boxes of kit supplies. Hartland UMC collected about 6 boxes and 7 empty buckets (See picture). The Conference will give another appeal in the Spring, probably in March.

Scrip Gift Card Ministry Comes to a Close



For seven years Hartland has been selling Scrip gift cards to stores, restaurants and others which we purchased for ourselves or for gifts to others. The church got a small percentage of income from each of these sales. It was decided it was time to end this program. The church received a total of \$2,880 dollars over the seven years.

Our thanks to Jeff and Linda Gordinier for coordinating this money raising ministry and all who purchased the cards over the years.


