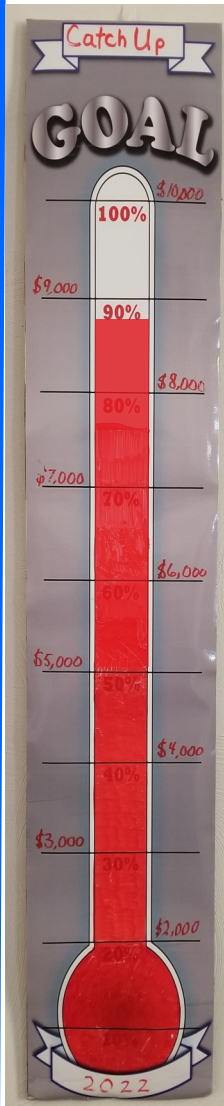

The 2022 Catch Up Campaign was successful! Thank you to all who participated in this important Fund Raising Drive. We raised 8,800 dollars!

As publicized, half of the total collected was given to Ministry Shares, which connects us to worthwhile United Methodist sponsored missions (and some administration costs) across the state and world. This raised our 2022 Ministry Share giving to (\$ 6,458) or 38% of our expected annual share based on the incomes received by all the churches of the Michigan Conference.

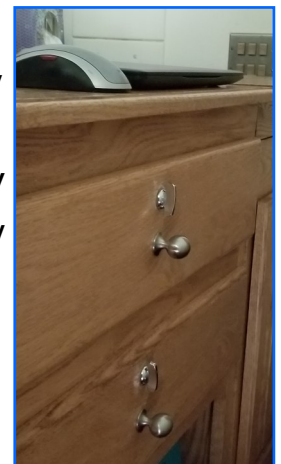

Beyond the routine maintenance checks and activities,

- ◆ Our thanks go to Jim Cleveland who replaced the weather beaten patio screen door at the "AA" entrance.
- ◆ A new timer for the outdoor sign was needed and replaced.
- ◆ Jeff Gordonier fixed a sink in the kitchen that was acting up.
- ◆ The top of a parking lot light had flown off, and it was re-caulked into place. (Second one this year)
- ◆ The toilet handle in the men's bathroom was replaced.
- ◆ The pilot light on the kitchen oven has been relit (several times).
- ◆ 30 + leaf bags were filled from the front lawn of the parsonage by Jerry Weaver (and Pastor).
- ◆ New latches and handles were donated and replaced for the A/V tech booth (the old ones tended to catch knees and eventually broke the key in the lock)
- ◆ Renewed the annual contract for snow removal (\$ 3,840/season)
- ◆ Hired the repair of damaged alarm system wiring (~ 800) which came to our attention when the church was power washed.

Build a mind and sportsmanship - Play Chess!

How does chess build a mind and teach sportsmanship? - Concentration, memory, problem solving analysis and calculation skills all improve when you play chess. And sportsmanship? Chess is a humbling game. You don't win a chess game. Your opponent loses by not playing as well as you. So showing respect for your opponent is just expected. Same when you lose. No reason to be mad at your opponent for playing better.

Isn't chess hard to learn? - No, simple to learn, but impossible to master. That is the beauty of the game. Famous chess quote: "Chess is a lake where a gnat may drink, or an elephant can bathe." You can enjoy the game at any depth you desire and never find the bottom.

Isn't chess boring? - Not if you like a competition relying on yourself, with no teammates, officials, or luck deciding the outcome. And once played, the beauty of the game becomes apparent. Every chess game is a unique artistic creation that will never be repeated.

Doesn't chess take a long time to play? - Not necessarily. It is up to the players as to how long they want to play. Chess timers can be used to play a game in 2 minutes! (5 minutes per player is the normal speed standard however). The time limit is up to the players involved. Chess by email, text and regular mail are also popular!

Is chess expensive? - Not at all. An official, and practically indestructible tournament chess set can be purchased for around \$30 and will last a lifetime with normal abuse. This is why chess is played all over the world. It is one of the most inexpensive games, hobby, or past time there is.

January - Four one-hour chess sessions. Each session is a chess lesson (15 to 30 min) and then playing the game every session (30 min or more) with the coach available.

Tournament chess set, board and carrying bag included - \$60 (for the first 4 sessions)

Feb (4 sessions), March (4 sessions), April (5 sessions) - All with (15 to 30 min) chess lesson and play session (30 min or more), only \$40 each month if paid monthly. (\$50 for April if not in the Jan, Feb and March classes)

May (3 sessions - with an in-class tournament) - \$30

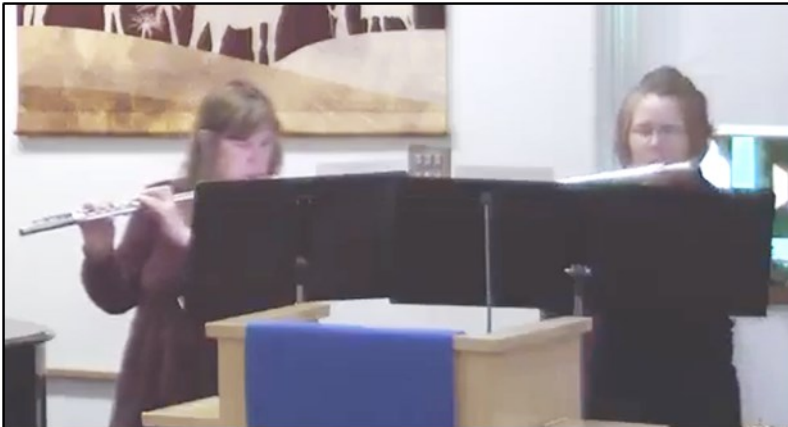

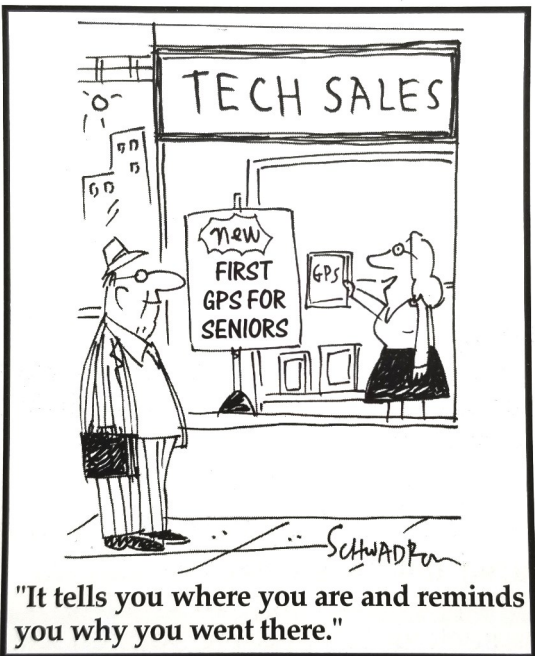

Nov 11 (cont) - The praise band led the music (above) and Terri Priess led the readings (left).



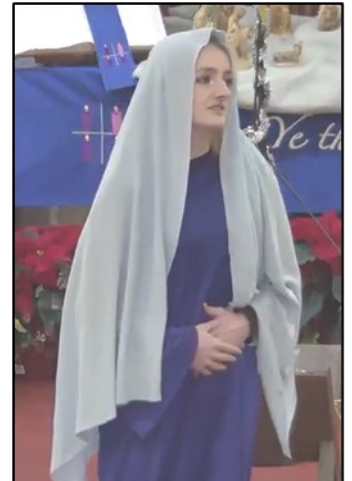
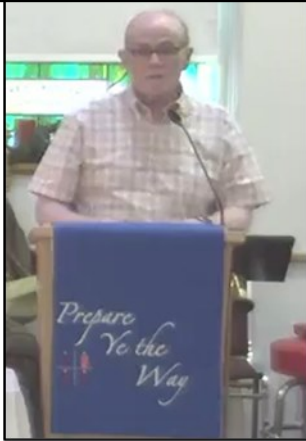

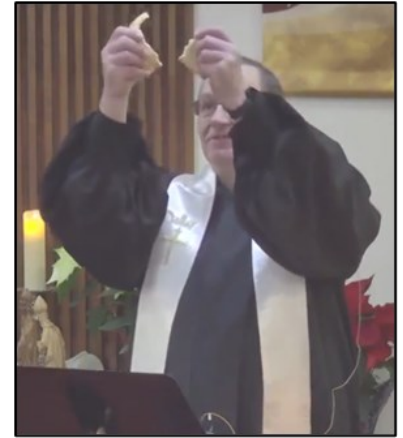

Beginning January 1, the pastor will be paid as a 3/4 time pastor. Hopefully this, along with a Conference grant, will help us gain financial and ministry footing as we move into our future.

Pastor Chuck will be having follow-up eye surgery January 20. Therefore, he will be on vacation from Jan 18 to 25. Terri Pries will be leading our worship on January 22.

¹ Normal means *regularly* scheduled, but at *infrequent* times the pastor may have off-site personal or parishioner appointments or emergencies that may take him away from the church during office hours. It will not be practical or possible to announce these ahead of time.

If on vacation or at a conference, we will try to announce these absences. and who to contact if he is also out of the area.

If Hartland schools are canceled due to weather, the office *may* also close, so if you have business with the office, be sure to call first on those days.
