## Call to Worship

Like the Magi long ago, we come to celebrate the radiance in Christian hearts, for the Everlasting God brought the nations to his light and kings to the brightness of his rising. Come to experience God showing himself to the nations and filling the world with his glory -- through Jesus Christ who is the true light and the bright and morning star. **Special Instrumental Music** On Epiphany, the magi came and offered their gifts which had multiple purposes, but the emphasis we get from the hymn is that gold represented Christ's kingship, frankincense (often burned as an aroma in worship) represented his divinity, and myrrh, a perfume used with other spices in embalming, representing his sacrificial death – and then the song concludes with rising from the stone-cold tomb as King, and God and sacrifice, we worship him. Donna and Kathy are going to play that song for us. **We Three Kings** 



## Intro to Reading



Lay Reader: We heard their story musically. The lyric also mentions that chasing the Christmas star was a long trip. It is not observed until 12 days after Christmas (January 6). The celebration of Epiphany has been around longer than Christmas, and it originally focused on the nativity, birth, and baptism of Christ. Today the emphasis has moved to the Magi, or wise men, or the kings arriving with their gifts. This celebration has been preserved and developed in most Latin American cultures in what they call Three Kings Day, or Day of the Kings. In worship, they use drama and special songs to relive the story of the magi and their gift giving --- like we did a few weeks ago... And at home, children are told to put hay under their beds so the traveling camels can eat the hay while the kings leave presents for the children.

(Synopsis from UM Book of Worship) Let's remind ourselves of some of the key points of the Magi's story as Matthew tells it.

## **Bible Reading**

Lay Reader: Jesus was born in the town of Bethlehem, in the country of Judea. Herod was the king. After Jesus was born, wise men came from the east to Jerusalem. They asked, `Where is the child who has been born to be King of the Jews? We saw his star rising and we have come to worship him.' ... the star, which they had seen rising, went in front of them. It stopped above the place where the child was. When they saw the star, they were very glad. They went into the house, and there they saw the child and Mary his mother. They kneeled down and worshipped him. Then they opened their bags and gave him gifts. These gifts were gold, and frankincense and myrrh. Matthew 2:1-2, 9b-11 (WE)

### Music

The intent is to convey through the magi event that they knew this was not just any ordinary king that would ascend to a Jewish throne – this was going to be a unique, special king who would draw all the nations to himself, which is why they were traveling so far to bring their gifts and worship. So just who was this baby Jesus and what kind king would he grow up to be? He was the one the prophets spoke of -- the powerful things that he would be and do, a light of hope dawning in the darkness of despair, a lion king who created and rules over nature and nations, a warrior who stands with those who are oppressed and frees them from whatever or whoever enslaves them, one who answers the troubled when they call, a sacrificial lamb that brings healing to the hurting. It is no wonder his name was Jesus – which means Savior.

## Intro to Bible Reading 2

Lay Reader: The story of God making himself known to the Gentiles concludes, but the full scope of its lesson is not always easy to learn and apply.

A God-fearing Gentile Roman army officer named Cornelius was praying. He envisioned an angel who told him that God has received his prayers and gifts to the poor as an offering, and to send some men to Joppa to fetch Simon Peter who is staying with a tanner named Simon who lives by the seashore. He immediately chose three people, informed them of the vision and their mission, and sent them. It is about a full day's walk. They were approaching the city about noon the next day.

The fact that Peter was staying with Simon the tanner is significant. Sometimes occupations are added to names to help distinguish them from other local people with the same name. But more importantly, Peter was staying with a man who had a profession that was despised because it included handling dead carcasses, which made a person "unclean" under Jewish law. This meant that Peter's faith had broadened somewhat beyond the restrictions of his upbringing. But he had a way to go.



Around noon, Peter was hungry. While the meal was being prepared, he went up on the flat rooftop to pray. He fell into a trance. He had a vision of heaven opening and a large sheet descending with all kinds of animals on it. A voice from heaven said, "Rise, kill, and eat." Peter refused, for he had never eaten anything that his upbringing said was impure and unclean (not kosher)."

The voice replied, "Don't call something unclean if God has made it clean." This vision happened three times. Then the sheet of animals suddenly returned to heaven. Peter was still puzzling over the meaning of this vision when men were calling for him at the gate of the house. The Spirit said to Peter, "Three men are looking for you, go with them without misgivings, because I have sent them."

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Peter went down and greeted them. They said why they had come, and he invited them to stay for the night. The next day Peter and some others from Joppa went with the trio back to Caesarea. They arrived the following day. Cornelius had already gathered all of his relatives and close friends and were waiting for them. Peter said, "It is against my religious laws to enter a Gentile home or associate with you, but God has told me <u>to not think of anyone as impure or unclean</u>. Why did you send for me?"

Cornelius told the angelic vision (that we have heard); that he immediately sent for him, and that it was good of him to come. He concluded: "Now we are all in here in the presence of God to hear what the Lord has commanded you to say.

(Summary of Acts 10:1-33)

And you can imagine Peter looking over these unfamiliar but eager faces as we pick up the reading...

## **Bible Reading**

Lay Reader: Then Peter began to speak, "I really understand now. God does not play favorites. He does not love some people more than others. But he accepts anyone who [reveres] him and does what is right. It does not matter to what people they belong.

"To the people of Israel God has sent the good news announcing shalom through Jesus Christ who is Lord of all! You know what has happened throughout Judea. It started in Galilee after the baptism which John talked about; how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power. Jesus went about doing good deeds. He healed all those who were oppressed by the Adversary because God was with him.

"We were witnesses of everything he did in the Judean countryside and in Jerusalem. They did away with him by hanging him on a piece of wood. But on the third day, God raised him up and let him be seen, not by all the people, but by witnesses God had previously chosen, that is, by us, who ate and drank with him after he rose from death.

"Then he commanded us to tell the people that God chose this man to judge the living and the dead. All the prophets bear witness to him. They say, "Everyone who puts their trust in him receives forgiveness of sins through his name."

## Sermon Why Did They Come?

Prior to Christmas, 5-year-old Randy wanted a toy western stagecoach as his gift. During a shopping trip with his mom, he found just the one he wanted. It was about 6" long and had cool wheels and dark brown plastic horses pulling it. "Mommy, I want this one. Pleeeease" he begged. He came near to throwing a tantrum, insisting that he get that stagecoach for Christmas. Mom finally closed the conversation with a "We'll see."

Randy was sure he'd get what he asked for. Christmas morning came, and he opened the package confidently. Sure enough, it was the stagecoach he had begged for. He was so pleased – until his older brother said, "You're stupid. Mom had already bought you a much bigger, much better stagecoach, but when you begged for that one, she exchanged it." Suddenly the small stagecoach didn't seem so appealing.

Pete went up for an afternoon prayer on the rooftop and I imagine he expected to experience what he usually experienced in his prayers. But this day, God had a whole different idea in mind, and prepared him to participate in helping launch a movement that would be incomprehensible to Peter. And even though it took a while, luckily, for all of us Gentiles, he listened and learned and reached out with God's message to people his lifelong learned traditions would have forbade. He wants to do so much more in this world than we ask or can possibly imagine.

We too may ask for too little in our prayers compared to what he may want to invite us to be and do as a part of in his work in the world. Can we continue to listen and learn?

**Prayer** Let's pray. Lord, we don't always know for what to ask for, what to pray for -- Even in Jesus day, they wanted survival, and felt they were dreaming big in asking for freedom from Rome. In that case, graciously, you didn't settle to give us what we asked, and instead you sent Jesus to offer us victory over death, give us eternal life, and a full life even now. Therefore, even if we don't know what to ask for, like Peter, teach us to listen and to cooperate with what you are telling us so that we can receive the gift that you want to give to us and through us to others, as Jesus lays that path out for us, and it is in Jesus name that we pray. Amen.
